

1. Get the Net

Measure the height and spread (width) of your tree. Calculate what size net you need.

((Height) + (Spread)) \times 2 = length of the side of a square net

For a 10' tall tree with 8' spread:

 $((10 + 8) \times 2) = (16 \times 2) = 32' \times 32'$ square net Using the 17' wide net on a roll, we typically use these sizes:

- 17' square
- 34' square (two 17' x 34' panels) close enough!





2. Thin Fruit and Install Structures

- Thin your fruit before netting
- Net before codling moths emerge, by late May
- Install structures to keep net away from fruit and leaves
- Use bamboo poles in different lengths with or without tennis balls

3. Cover the Tree

- Grab a friend or two and some long bamboo poles
- Lay netting flat on the ground in front of your tree
- Loosely secure the two front corners to bamboo poles
- Hoist the net over the top of the tree and guide the sides down so they drape evenly on all sides





4. Close it Up

- Pull netting to the tree trunk and secure with a stretchy, weatherproof tie
- Use zip ties to close gaps in sides of net that don't reach the trunk
- Leave net on the tree until harvest
- Remove fallen fruit or leaves caught in the net throughout the season
- After harvest, shake off any leaves, fold it up and store it for next year



Keep your apples and pears bug damage-free with Fruit Tree Netting

Also called anti-hail or bee netting
HDPE (high density polyethylene) filament
Reusable, lasts at least six years
Does not ravel or rip easily

Full Roll of netting
